### **Head Start Performance Standards**

§ 1302.14

### **Policy**

Children, pregnant women, and pregnant people are selected for enrollment according to the established criteria that weigh the prioritization of the selection of the highest-need participants. The selection criteria are established annually based on the needs identified in the Community Needs Assessment. The identified needs will also include family income, children experiencing homelessness, children in foster care, children's age, children with special needs, and other risk factors. The selection criteria must be approved by the Community Action Head Start Policy Council and the Community Action Board of Directors before being implemented.

### **Selection Procedure**

#### **Selection Process**

- 1. Once eligibility has been determined, a child or a pregnant woman or a pregnant person is placed on the waitlist, and the selection criteria points are assigned.
- 2. The waitlist is sorted by the number of criteria points assigned to each child or pregnant woman or pregnant person based on their level of need. The children or pregnant women or pregnant person with the highest criteria points are selected for the program.
  - The waitlist is sorted by order of eligibility points (highest first), then class age.
  - In the Early Head Start program, children with the order of eligibility points (highest first), then class age (youngest first).
  - In the Head Start program, children are grouped according to eligibility points (highest first), then class age (oldest first).
  - When the eligibility points are equal between two participants, the child's age will determine who is offered enrollment first. In the Head Start program, the oldest child is prioritized for enrollment. In the Early Head Start program, the youngest child is prioritized for enrollment.
- 3. Once a child, pregnant woman, or pregnant person is selected for the program, the enrollment process is followed. Refer to Enrollment—Center-Based or Home-Based Policy and Procedure.

#### **Over-Income Families**

Only 10% of all children and pregnant women, regardless of eligibility points, may be over income. An additional 35% of children and pregnant women may be from families whose incomes do not exceed 130% of the Federal Poverty Income Guidelines. Overcome participants will be selected when no income-eligible children are on the waitlist.

The Head Start Director and ERSEA Supervisor must review and approve the enrollment of over-income children to ensure the thresholds are met and maintained as indicated in the Head Start Performance Standards.

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
